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The SEIAA in its meeting held on 07.10.2015 observed that the proximity of mining sites from habitation, water bodies, reserved forest and architectural structures of heritage importance is likely to affect the environment adversely due to the impact of mining activity. Hence, the SEAC is requested to examine the adverse environmental impact of existing mine(s) by taking up sample study to arrive at certain precautionary distance to enable SEAC while processing the new mining proposals for issuance of EC. Thus, the SEIAA referred the proposal to SEAC to re-examine the above issues.

The SEAC noted that decision of SEIAA and after detailed discussions, the SEAC opined that the proximity of mining sites from nearest habitation, water bodies, reserved forest and architectural structures of heritage importance shall be as following:



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The SEIAA in its meeting held on 07.10.2015 referred the proposal to SEAC for submission of revised detailed EMP covering physical and financial targets duly incorporating into comprehensive proposal.

The proponent submitted revised EMP report covering physical and financial targets duly incorporating into comprehensive proposal. The SEAC noted the decision of SEIAA and after detailed discussions & re-examination, the SEAC observed that the revised EMP report submitted by the project proponent is satisfactory. In view of the above, the item is again recommended for issue of EC.

<b>Agenda Item: 16</b>	<b>1.0 Ha. Black Granite Mine of M/s. Sri B. Gopal Reddy , Sy.No: 428 &amp; 429 , Kakloor (V) , Shabad (M) , Ranga Reddy District – Environmental Clearance - Reg.</b>
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Earlier, the SEAC observed that nearest human habitation viz., Sardarnagar Village is existing at a distance of 0.1 km and a water body exists at 0.3 km away from Mine Lease Area. Hence, a Sub-committee was constituted to inspect the site and to submit a report on present status of the project & impacts of the project on the nearest human habitation, water body & surrounding environment, etc. Accordingly, the Sub-Committee inspected the site on 22.08.2015 and submitted the report. The report of the Sub-Committee was examined in detail.

  
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It was reported that the proposed site is found to be about 100 meters from the Shivalayam temple and 200 meters from the school. Beyond these, the village Sardarnagar spread over, which has the population of 5 to 6 thousands. In view of the closeness of Sardarnagar village to the mining area, the Sub-Committee members had a meeting with village Sarpanch, the temple priests and some prominent inhabitants of village at the proposed site. Everybody has expressed their willingness and supported the mining activity. This activity, in their opinion, can generate some revenue resource to the village, the priests of the temple and will help others. Letters of 'No Objection' from Sardarnagar Sarpanch, Head Masters of both the schools and temple priests have been submitted by the proponent. Further the proponent had submitted a letter to compensate the damages if any occur to the men and material of the school and temple areas.

Further, the Sub-Committee members reviewed previous similar cases with regard to 'the distance' of the mining site that is admissible from the human habitations and water bodies to arrive at conclusion for the present case, which are given in the references below:

1. In MINERAL CONCESSION RULES, 1960 (As amended up to 26th July, 2012) it has been stated that "No mining operations within 50 metres of public works etc."
2. MOEF has given EC for Jharia coal fields "Mining shall be carried out as per statuette from the streams/nalas flowing within the lease and maintaining a safe distance from the Nalas flowing along the lease boundary. A safety barrier of a minimum 60m width shall be maintained along the nalas/water bodies".(Approval letter no. No. J-11015/213/2010-IA.II (M) dt6th Feb.2013.and No. J-11015/35/2011-IA.II (M) dt.6<sup>th</sup> Feb 2013.

After detailed discussions, the SEAC recommends the project issue of EC.
