

**PROCEEDINGS OF THE ENVIRONMENTAL PUBLIC HEARING FOR THE PROPOSED EXPANSION OF THE EXISTING DRUG INTERMEDIATES MANUFACTURING FACILITY TO BULK DRUG & INTERMEDIATES MANUFACTURING FACILITY OF M/S. ENAL DRUGS (P) LTD., UNIT-II, HELD ON 23.01.2016 AT 11.15 AM NEAR THE EXISTING PLANT PREMISES, VANGAPALLY (V), YADAGIRIGUTTA (M), NALGONDA DISTRICT.**

At the outset, the Senior Environmental Engineer, TSPCB, Regional Office, Nalgonda, while welcoming the District Revenue Officer, Nalgonda District and public, explained about the EIA Notification 2006 of the Ministry of Environment and Forests, Government of India's EIA Notification No. S.O. 1533 (E) dated 14<sup>th</sup> September 2006. The Environmental Public hearing is made mandatory for certain category of projects to obtain prior environmental clearance. He stated that M/s. Enal Drugs (P) Ltd., Unit-II has proposed to expand existing API Intermediates to Active Pharmaceutical Ingredients (APIs) & API Intermediates manufacturing facility in Sy.No. 38/A, 39, 39/A, 40/B/2 & 41/C in 6.45 Ha located at Vangapally (V), Yadagirigutta (M), Nalgonda District.

The industry obtained TOR (Terms of Reference) from the Ministry of Environment and Forests (MoEF), GoI, New Delhi and submitted draft EIA report to the Pollution Control Board and requested to conduct public hearing.

Accordingly, a press notification was published in Telugu and English daily news papers on 21.12.2015 (i.e., Surya Telugu Daily News paper and The New Indian Express).

The said notification invited public suggestions, concerns, comments and objections, if any, on the proposed project. He added that the copies of Draft Environment Impact Assessment/Environmental Management Plan (EIA/EMP) report and the executive summary in Telugu & English were made available to the people as mentioned in the press notification.

He further informed that the hearing is intended only to record the views, opinions, objections and suggestions of the participants and same will be conducted in a transparent manner and the proceedings will be video recorded. The minutes of the hearing along with the representations will be forwarded to the MoEF, New Delhi for further course of action. He then requested the District Revenue Officer, Nalgonda to preside over the public hearing process.

**The District Revenue Officer, Nalgonda** requested the management of the industry and their consultants to explain in detail, the salient features of the proposed expansion project.

**Sri J. Srinivas, Head (Quality control), M/s. Enal Drugs (P) Ltd.,** has expressed the following:

- Our managing director is highly qualified and well experienced in Bulk Drug industry and he belongs to this area. He established this industry for providing jobs to this area people and to develop this area.
- The industry proposed to take up the expansion in 3 phases.
- The industry proposed to produce 12 Bulk drugs products (API) and also proposed to produce 12 Drug Intermediates i.e., total 24 products are proposed and applied for permission to the MoEF.
- As per TOR issued by the MoEF, draft EIA study was conducted through consultant and submitted report to the TSPCB, Nalgonda to conduct Public Hearing.
- Accordingly this public hearing is being conducted.
- There will be increase in employment in this area due to proposed expansion project which gives direct employment of 450 and indirect employment of 150 i.e., total of 600 families will be benefitted.
- As per CSR policy, the industry proposed to take up village development programmes, Library development, rooms & water supply to the schools in 5 years period with consultation with villagers and public representatives.
- They also proposed to give sports items to the school children.
- The industry already developed greenbelt in 35% area of the industry i.e., 5.58 Acres of greenbelt.
- He assured that there shall not be any problems to harm the environment and also their responsibility for the same.
- He requested the public to offer valuable views and suggestions.
- He informed that their consultant will explain and clarify about the project.

**Sri J. Thirumalesh, Director (Technical) M/s. KKB Envirocare Consultants (P) Ltd., Hyderabad** has reported the following:

- The industry proposed this expansion in an extent of about 16 Acres.
- The industry proposed to produce 24 Bulk Drug and Intermediates products as per the market demand which will be produced in campaign method i.e., produce 6 Bulk Drug and Intermediates products at any point of time.
- The industry proposed to take up the expansion in 3 phases.
- During production of Bulk drug products, Water pollution, Air pollution and Noise pollution are generated.

- As per the TOR issued by MoEF and CC, GoI, EIA study has to be conducted within 10 Km radius for surface & ground water quality, Air quality and Noise.
- They conducted study at plant site and surrounding villages i.e., Marrigudem, Challur, Mallappagutta RF, Vangapally, Nagaram (Ahemed Nagar), Chinnakondur & Dilwarpur.
- Values of PM<sub>10</sub>, PM<sub>2.5</sub>, SO<sub>2</sub>, NO<sub>x</sub> & VOC are within the prescribed standards of Pollution Control Board.
- The study was conducted by identifying the pollutants to be generated from the process of the products and estimated its effect in the study.
- For proposed expansion project, water consumption is 388 KLD which is to be met from ground water source.
- The total effluent generation will be 196 KLD. These effluents will be segregated into High TDS and Low TDS as per their TDS.
- High TDS of 151 KLD will be sent to stripper to remove COD and evaporated through Multiple effect evaporator.
- MEE condensate and Low TDS of 45 KLD will be treated in effluent treatment plant followed by pressure sand filter & activated Carbon filter. This treated effluent will be sent to RO system for treatment and RO permeate will be used for cooling tower and boiler.
- If the pollution control equipment are under repair / maintenance, the effluent will be stored in guard tank for further treatment. Standby pumps and regular required accessories will be kept ready in store room.
- Effluent treatment tanks will be constructed at least one metre above the ground with RCC, thereby there will not be any ground water pollution.
- Emissions will be generated from boiler, DG sets and process emissions during Bulk Drug production.
- The industry proposed to generate 31.39 TPD of solid waste and same will be collected in HDPE bags and stored on elevated platform with cover and leachate collection. The industry will dispose this waste to TSDF, Dundigal & Cement units duly following manifest system.
- Boiler ash of 24 TPD will be disposed to brick units.
- The industry proposed to develop the greenbelt within the industry and along the compound wall to the maximum extend. Thereby it will act as barrier to the outside environment from pollution and noise.
- The industry allotted 35% area i.e., 5.58 Acres (2.26 Ha) out of total area of 6.45 Ha. For which they will use 30 KLD of water for greenbelt development.
- As per the industry policy, natural resources will be minimum and the industry proposed to provide rain water harvesting systems to increase the ground water levels by consulting with ground water department and PCB.
- Public co-operation will be required for smooth running of the industry. Hence, the industry has to take up the required welfare measures under CSR programme in consulting the villagers for development of villages.

**The District Revenue Officer, Nalgonda** has informed that initiatives and technical description are expressed by the industry representative and their consultant. He requested the gathering, public representatives and NGO's to express their views. He also informed that the public can also submit the representations.

**Sri G. Mahendar Reddy, Vangapally** has expressed the following:

- This is a good sign one unit is going for expansion and happy about it.
- The government introduced the TS-iPass system for issuing permission for establishment of the industries in 15 days so as to encourage investments and creating jobs.
- Telangana State is formed for getting funds, water and employment to the Telangana people.
- The proposed project will give direct and indirect benefits to the villagers.
- He requested to provide job security and give required wages to the employees.
- Pollution is causing from tannery units in this area and not to oppose this drug unit. Earlier they opposed the establishment of the tannery units and made agitation.
- The industry shall follow the norms and rules in controlling the pollution.
- Lot of unemployment is facing in this area and there is requirement to come up more industries.
- He requested the industry to ensure that there shall not be any pollution problems to the surroundings.
- He requested to provide jobs to local people.
- He supported the project.

**Smt. Ch. Nirosha, Sarpanch, Vangapally** has expressed the following:

- She expressed happiness for the establishment of the proposed expansion in this area.
- There will be merits and demerits due to establishment of the industry.
- She requested the industry to take measures to control pollution.
- She requested to take up the village development programmes.

**Smt. Aruna, Sarpanch, Chollair** has expressed the following:

- M/s. Enal Drugs establishment is ok for them.
- Jobs will be generated due to proposed project.
- She requested to provide jobs for the locals.
- She insisted the industry management that they shall not cause any pollution problems to the surrounding villages.

**Sri Ilaiah, Ward member, Vangapally** has expressed the following:

- While welcoming the project, he requested the industry that there shall not be any pollution problems to the surroundings.

**Sri Md. Ajju, V.Y. President, Vangapally** has expressed the following:

- M/s. Enal Drugs is going for Environmental Public Hearing.
- The industry has developed good greenbelt.
- 4 – 5 villages are depended on this industry.
- There are no pollution problems to these villages due to this industry.
- There is lot of unemployment in the village.
- He requested to give more jobs to unemployed youth in the villages.

- He requested to remove the labour contract system in the industry and take on regular basis with minimum wage of Rs.7000/- and permanent them.
- He requested to give funds of Rs 5 – 10 Lakhs for CC road for Chollair and provide health faculties.
- He welcomed the project.

**Sri Repaka Swamy, Vice Sarpanch, Vangapally** has expressed the following:

- The industry is not causing pollution problems to the villages.
- He requested the industry to ensure that there shall not be any pollution problems.
- He emphasized the requirement of more industries to generate employment to the villagers to solve the unemployment problem.
- He requested the industry to extend their cooperation for education, water and health facilities.
- No loss due to this industry for the villagers.

- Industrialization will lead to the development of the villages.
- The industry developed the plantation and maintaining Sheep, Birds, Cattle etc., in the premises thereby giving the importance to the environment.
- There is a requirement to welcome the industries as the State is newly formed and also give importance on environment protection.
- He requested the industry to develop the greenbelt up to 40% as the state is having 30% forest and decreasing day by day.
- He requested to ensure that there shall not be any pollution problems to animals, birds & mankind etc.,
- He requested not to discharge the effluents onland and not cause pollution problems.
- He requested to evaporate the effluents and follow the Pollution Control Board norms.
- He welcomed the project and requested to send the report to MoEF for permissions.

- He requested not to discharge effluent on-land and take necessary measures for handling of effluents.
- Industry shall take environmental protection measures and PCB shall verify and accord permission.

- Earlier, 60 farmers in the village now reduced to 6 farmers and 2 farmers in the Vangapally, village due to real estate development in this area.
- Industry is maintaining cattle, sheep, duck, birds in the premises.
- Labour of Wangapalli are famous for skilled one and obedient in work.
- He requested to cover ESI & PF for all workers.
- He requested to establish the units for women employment.
- He requested to extend their co-operation for education, health etc.,
- He requested to take development programmes.
- If no effect from the unit they welcome the proposed project.

**Sri Terapa Ramulu, President, BC Sangham, Alair** has expressed the following:

- There will be lot of problems in establishing the industries.
- Hon'ble MLA co-operated in establishing industries.
- Students left the villages due to unemployment.
- He requested to provide jobs to the unemployed youth as per their eligibility.
- Industry shall take all measures to control pollution problems.

- CSR is under Govt. purview and he suggested to utilize the funds for village development programmes.

**Sri S. Nagasena Reddy, NGO** has expressed the following:

- M/s. Enal Drugs has proposed the expansion project for which EPH is must as per the EIA notification.
- EPH is conducted near the project site to obtain views of the people on the proposed project and it will be conducted under the chairmanship of the District Collector or his representative. The minutes of the Public Hearing will be communicated to the MoEF.
- The industry investing for expansion from Rs.2.5 Cr. to 40 Cr.
- The industry proposed to expand production from 9 – 10 TPA of Drug intermediates to 1800 TPA Bulk Drug API products.
- This is a major expansion project and there is a possibility of pollution problem.
- The industry is having good opinion in the village.
- The industry has proposed to spend 10 to 20% of investment towards pollution control equipment and their operation.
- The industry proposing 20,000 plants which is not sufficient and industry has to develop more plantation to face unexpected incident occurring.
- He requested to allot more funds for development of greenbelt.
- The Government has planted more plants under Harithaharam but plants are not survived. Hence, the industry has to ensure for plantation growth continuously.
- The industry is giving jobs to the villagers.
- He requested to provide skill development and technical training programmes to the youth as the industry cannot give jobs to all the people.
- The industry provided 100 jobs presently and provide 400- 500 jobs in future.
- This area is become sensitive as the government prestigious Yadadri Temple is under development.
- He requested to respond positively for development and clear the apprehensions of the public.
- He recommended to send the report to MoEF for permission.

**Sri J. Ravinder, NGO** has expressed the following:

- He extended his support for this expansion project.
- He requested to provide jobs to SC & ST youth.
- He requested to conduct health camps for villagers.



**Sri G. Vijaya Reddy, NGO** has expressed the following:

- The industry will provide rain water harvesting systems to harvest 10 Lakh liters of rain water.
- Medical camps will be conducted.
- Safety equipments like goggles, safety shoes etc., are already given to employees.
- No ESI provisions in this area earlier and now they are implementing ESI.
- The industry will follow all suggestions made by the speakers.
